
## BEYOND PHYSICAL

Rajinder Singh reveals his preparations for the afterlife in his exhibition, *Cage of Deliverance*.



















Rajinder Singh is not unaware of the immanence of death. As something that is unavoidable, the Ipoh, Perakborn artist chooses, instead, to focus on preparing himself physically, spiritually and mentally for a subject that most, instinctively, prefer to evade. The results of his exploration are the subject of an exhibition, *Cage* of Deliverance, which opens this month at Wei-Ling Contemporary. For inspiration, the London-based Rajinder scrutinised his past for fragments of unanswered questions and gods, as well as the rituals and ceremonies that he once practiced, to create 'cages' that signify the tranquillity and obliviousness that come with the acceptance of death.

With a PhD in philosophy and mathematics, Rajinder retains a fascination for otherworldly subject matters, basing his works on the notion of spaces that distend from apertures and portals, in that, while objects like a shrine, temple or prayer mat are located in the real world, they are, somehow, connected to another distant and unknown realm. These triumphs of the human spirit over flesh are, for Rajinder, a final rite, a preparation for moving on into the afterlife, breaking free from physical paradigms for the metaphysical beyond. (1)
