Wong Chee Meng

Malaysian artist Wong Chee Meng's newest exhibition, 'Journey to the South' peers into the experiences of Malaysians who migrated to Singapore seeking better opportunities. Inspired by anecdotes from friends and family during the 80s and 90s, Wong illuminates the stories of these immigrants. Some left for education and jobs, returning home with success, while others forged permanent lives in Singapore.
