Biography

Leon Leong is a Malaysian artist and author. His work typically addresses man's interaction with the built environment and explores the broader themes of people, place, and history. It combines social critique and creative storytelling, weaving fact and fiction, documentation and memory into narratives. Leon has had solos at Richard Koh Fine Art and Cult Gallery, and a number of group shows in Malaysia. His work Stilt Houses-The Floating World of Kampung Baru 2022 was shown at Ilham Gallery's Triennial Ilham Art Show 2022, and then at the IX Tashkent International Biennale of Contemporary Art, where it received a special jury prize. His mixed-medium installation series Cracks in the Wall 2018 was shown at the inaugural Kuala Lumpur Biennale and featured in the UNESCO Asia-Pacific Heritage 20/20 Forum. Leon's novel Beautiful Things 2006, published by Crown Publishing Taiwan and serialized in Sin Chew Daily, was a top five finalist for the Crown World Fiction Prize. His short stories have won international accolades and included in an anthology of Malaysian fiction. In 1992, he got a Bachelor of Science in Communication from The University of Texas at Austin in the United States.

Artist Statement

My work typically responds to man's relationship with the built environment and explores the broader themes of people, place and history. A combination of social commentary and creative storytelling, it interweaves fact and fiction, documentation and memory to construct narratives. I am interested in the interstices from which innovation happens, which one linguist describes as 'the intersection of cultures [where] each one modifies and enhances what is borrowed from its neighbors. [...] these "between" places, the ancient clash of civilizations, the modern clash of culture, the covert clues to human cognition, society, and evolution.' (Dan Jurafsky, "The Language of Food")

My fascination with these "between places" likely stemmed from my growing up as a son of a diaspora in a multiracial Southeast Asian country—an experience that positioned me on the outside, looking in. Later years lived in the West and the Middle East only heightened this sensitivity. Home is a recurring motif and theatre of history in my work, as I rethink the deep interconnectedness of societies and tribes.

My approach is context-based, derived from the people and place, culture and history. I prefer to paint live and in-person, often relocating to my subjects' home environments. Living and working closely with my subjects to gain first-hand knowledge is a crucial part of my process. I plot distance and space on the canvas—a Cartesian coordinate system of sorts—against which the characters effect an action. Colours, patterns and forms adapt and reform with stories and gossips, to make new conjunctions. Figures and grounds are fluxional, blurring the boundaries between the causal effect of action-reaction and destinable forces of genius loci, to seek alternatives to what we know. I play with non-linear perspective and spatial simultaneity to find unexplored possibilities in visual storytelling.

Inseparable from my work is my love of literature. I borrow structures from literature to make my series, to maintain a relationship between individual works, allowing tangential thinking and the freedom to investigate different ideas, so a series may paint a bigger picture than the sum of its parts. I have in recent years extended my medium to installation and film. They are an outgrowth of my curious desire to engage with the transitioning world around us.
